Sgt. Leopold Gordon Alexander 1311746 RAFVR



Leopold was an Air Gunner and served in 49 Squadron based at RAF Fiskerton. He was killed on 2 February 1943 on the crew's first operation from Fiskerton. He was 30 years old.

On the night of Tuesday 2 February 1943, 7 Lancasters climbed out of Fiskerton through thick cloud. A force of 161 four-engined bombers converged over Cologne that night and Bomber Command lost 5 aircraft in total: 3 Lancasters, 1 Halifax and 1 H2S equipped Pathfinder Stirling. Leopold's aircraft was shot down by a night fighter and crashed between Kessel and Helden in Holland.

He and five other crew members are buried in Nijmegen Cemetery in Holland.
