## Sgt Ronald Frank Arnold 1890774 RAFVR

Ronald Arnold was the rear gunner of one of three 166 Squadron Lancasters lost during the disastrous Mailly-le-Camp raid in the late spring of 1944.

The attack on the night of May 3/4 1944, by 346 Lancasters and 16 Mosquitoes on a German military camp to the east of Paris, was dogged by poor communications, leaving bombers circling what turned out to be a night fighter beacon waiting for instructions to bomb. This was where many of the lost 42 Lancasters were shot down, including William Myers' aircraft, ME643 AS-E.

The aircraft crashed near the small town of Saint-Memmie, in the Marne region east of Paris. The crew are now buried in Courtisols Churchyard along



with nine other aircrew all killed in



the same month. These include a 12 Squadron crew shot down on the same night.

The others who died were the pilot P/O William Myers, flight engineer Sgt. Robert Green, navigator Flt. Sgt. Stanley Wilson, bomb-aimer P/O Anthony Pappajohn RCAF, wireless operator Flt. Sgt. William Jones and mid-upper gunner Sgt. Joseph Kenny.
