Flt. Sgt. Ernest Charles Atkinson 650052 RAF



Ernest Atkinson was the wireless operator/air gunner in a Hampden lost along with his crew in an attack on a German chemical factory.

His was one of 20 Hampdens sent by 49 Squadron from Scampton to the chemical factory at Huls, near Krefeld, on the night of 28/29 December 1941. Some 81 Hampdens from 5 Group took part in the attack, which was reported to have been successful, with three others lost in the raid.

Ernest was flying in AE419 EA-T, which is believed to have crashed in the sea. No trace of the aircraft, or the four-man crew, was found and all those on board are remembered on the Runnymede Memorial.

He came from Islington in north London and was the 21-year-old son of Samuel and Alice Atkinson. The others who died were the pilot Sgt. Archie Watt, observer Sgt. Ted Sawdy and air gunner Sgt. Henry Wisdom.
