Sgt. Jan Ksiezyc P.792827 PAF



Jan was born on 21 December 1914 in Brzezinka, Chrzanow, Poland.

He was a Wireless Operator serving with the Polish Air Force, as part of No. 18 OTU at RAF Bramcote, Warwickshire, and had previously been awarded the ML (Polish Air Force Medal).

Wellington IC R3216 WS-K took off from Bitteswell airfield on 29 September 1941, on an evening navigational exercise. At 2150 hours, on its return, the aircraft stalled and crashed as it approached Bitteswell, a satellite station often used by training units. Of the eight-man crew on board, only one survived. Sgt Zietkiewicz PAF was rescued by a motor transport driver, S W J Green, whose bravery was subsequently recognised through the award of the George Medal.

Jan is buried at Nuneaton (Oaston Road) Cemetery, Warwickshire. Sec. H. Coll. Grave 103. He was 26 years old.
